



DEVICE IMAGING AND INTEGRATION IPADS IN ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

Package creation in LANDESK continued this week, with almost all secondary Science and Math packages complete. The rest of these packages will be completed next week. The entire team is working on this project simultaneously with their other tasks.

After discussion regarding Apple no longer supporting QuickTime due to various security holes, it was decided to remove QuickTime from both ZENWorks and LANESK Workspaces. Although QuickTime is still required for certain programs to work, it will be installed in the background as part of the bundle/package. The district curriculum coordinators are currently looking at alternatives to programs that require QuickTime, while companies are also trying to update their software as soon as possible to remove the QuickTime requirement.
