



Webinar with TASB About Senate Bill 507: Cameras in Special Education Classrooms (Recommendations)

Frankie Jackson participated in a Senate Bill 507 webinar given by the Texas Association for School Boards (TASB) on Friday, **May 13, 2016**, with Teresa Hull's executive committee that is researching options, costs, and processes for CyFair ISD. The committee will be proposing new processes for requesting camera installations as well as setting up a classroom proof of concept, as we prepare for the ruling to go into affect in August 2016.



How to Move Forward with Cameras in the Classroom

The proposed rules on the law requiring cameras in certain special education classrooms offer a preliminary look at what you should be doing to gear up for the next school year. While the Texas Education Agency has requested an expedited opinion from the Texas Attorney General's office on a few of the issues raised by the law, it could be months before an opinion is offered.

In the meantime, what are districts to do? The best plan is to move ahead with the draft rules that TEA has written, and begin building the technology structure and policies that will likely be needed
