The Texas K-12 CTO Council Leadership Advisory subcommittee hosted a Trusted Learning Environment (TLE) focus group meeting on Friday, September 29, 2017 from 11:00 a.m. – 11:40 a.m.. The group used the council's zoom call in number to conduct the call. Frankie Jackson served as the facilitator for the meeting. The following are the items discussed.

1. The following action items are open from the last conference call. Discussed the status of each.

to begin development of common agreements and other policies.		
They host monthly calls if you are interested.		
- I think the TLE stands alone, but you all could encourage those to		
join in the conversations of the TxSDPA. CTO Council paid the dues		
for the consortium so that all of our members have a subscription	Frankie	
for free. We talked about this at the clinic and in subsequent		
newsletters. I certainly think we can remind people about utilizing		
this free resource.

Session Title: Building Your district's Technology Learning Environment with a Seal of Approval

Session Objective: In a panel discussion learn why two districts made student data privacy a priority and obtained a Trusted Learning Environment (TLE) seal of approval.

Session Description: With increasing concerns about cybersecurity and data privacy, and the demanding reliance on internet accessibility, district technology environments are subject to more scrutiny than ever before. The expectation is that student learning environments are trusted and secure. In an interactive panel discussion, learn how two districts analyzed the technological aspects of their learning environments, transformed their processes, and obtained the Trusted Learning Environment (TLE) seal of approval.

Session Format / Facilitation Style — Moderator will lead an interactive panel discussion with CTOs from two districts

Session Title: Student Data Privacy and Security: Building A Trusted Learning Environment (TLE)

Session Objective: Introduce the Trusted Learning Environment (TLE) seal of approval designed to help districts manage and improve student data privacy and cybersecurity

Session Description: The risk of managing student data privacy and cybersecurity has never been more challenging. Increased liability and legal requirements associated with building trusted learning environments is one of the greatest concerns of this generation. Learn how the Texas K-12 Chief Technology Officer Council's Leadership Advisory is working together to aggressively address this problem. Hear how 11 districts in the state are working together to improve cybersecurity and seeking the TLE seal of approval

Session Format / Facilitation Style — Formal presentation about the TLE with audience participation and interactivity

THIS MATRIX is being used to maximize our sharing of information to organize where each district is in the process of developing TLEs and applying for the TLE seal. Each district will status where they are in the process of building their TLE including Aldine, Austin, CyFair, Houston, McKinney, Northside, and Round Rock.

Learn about how the TLE Seal Program can help you shape, improve and prioritize your student data privacy program and better communicate with parents and other community stakeholders about how you properly manage student data. Also hear guidance from TLE Seal recipients about how they approached the TLE application, including how they worked with their school system leadership and the strategies they used to manage the application process.

6. Each district's action is to continue working on the matrix in each of the 25 TLE areas indicating where the district is in terms of preparation. Information may include artifacts, rationale, areas for improvement, new ideas, best practices, where help is needed, links to information, etc. As the group works through the matrix, more ideas about how to manage the focus group's efforts will evolve.
