# Technology Festival 2018!

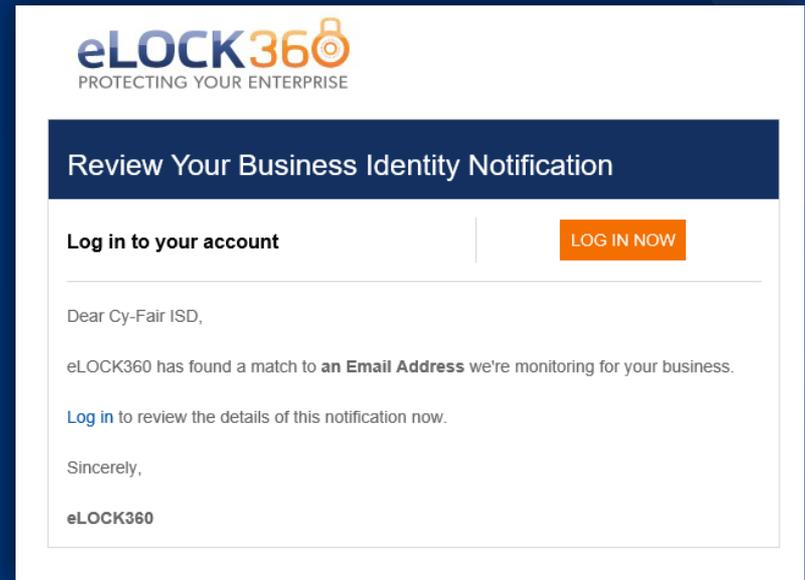

# Resolving Accounts with eLOCK360

eLOCK360 notifies CFISD when compromised accounts have been discovered on the web. On **Tuesday, April 10**, a notification was received by the Cybersecurity team. **Eric Pina** ran the report of the compromised accounts. This information is then cross-referenced against Active Directory and eFinance employee directory. Each account status was determined. Based on the account status, emails and phone calls were placed to the affected users by **Eric Pina** and **James Costello**. This gave the Cybersecurity team an opportunity to discuss with the user the efforts we are making as a district to ensure their credentials stay safe. Each user contacted greatly appreciated the response and awareness shown by the District.





# Technology Festival

On **Thursday, April 12, 2018**, **James Costello** and **Jennifer Miller** participated in the Technology Festival. The Technology Festival was held at the Berry Center from 5:30 – 7:30. This was the first time the Cybersecurity team was invited to participate in the Festival.
