<p>If a student loses the device, we use Absolute CompuTrace to track the device. If it is not found within their time frame, Absolute reimburses us the cost of the device.</p>	<p>If an employee loses a device, some have CompuTrace on them and would follow the same procedures as the student device. If it does not have CompuTrace on it, then the department/campus bears the cost of replacement (but generally we have a few spares on hand to cover incidents).</p>	<p>Yes</p>	<p>Klein ISD</p>	<p>I will send copies of our teacher mobile device handbook and our student mobile device handbook that outline the responsibilities for students and teachers with regards to their device - including if it is damaged intentionally, accidentally, or stolen. We also have forms that both groups sign highlighting important aspects and agreeing to follow the handbooks.</p> <p>We also have procedures in place for stolen devices with our police department regarding how long before a case number is issued and a new device is given to a student or teacher.</p>
