Student Misuse of Technology

Student misuse of technology can be addressed as a Level II and/or III infraction in the Student Code of Conduct.

Level II

- Cheating/plagiarism (CC-13)
- Unauthorized alteration or deletion of digital files (CC-13)
- Violating the District electronic devices policy (CC-13)

Level III

- Misuse of District technology, including, but not limited to, the Internet, the District network, or District-owned equipment or software (CC-16)

Student Misuse of Technology

Level IV

Should the incident in question result in felony conduct on-campus, this scenario would result in a Level IV Mandatory Placement to our DAEP.



Protocol for Addressing Student Access

1. Contact Student Services
2. Plan B for Academic Needs
3. Student Services will facilitate through Technology Services





■ Governance

- “Collaboration” Application Control Category
 - Currently “Collaboration” is blocked at Application Control level
 - Sites opened – Google docs, WebEx, Duolingo
 - Wikispaces is blocked
 - Should “Collaboration” be opened at the Application Control level?



■ Governance

- Generic Student User IDs
 - Examples: ADASTU, BNESTU, ARASTU, CFLSTU
 - Primary purpose - testing
 - Used by Librarians to shorten login times
 - Password is being shared at the campus
 - Issue – loss of accountability
 - Should generic user ids still be used?
