



# Greg Rhodes Service-Oriented

What seemed to be a major issue on Friday, **October 23, 2015** turned out to be quickly resolved over the weekend, all because **Greg Rhodes** took it upon himself to find a creative solution to help Journalism teachers with their “out of network space” issues as they work to prepare yearbooks for high school students.

On Friday, Kenya Turner, Director of High School Curriculum and Instruction, communicated a very high level of frustration on behalf of Journalism teachers because there is a shortage of network and file space for the 2015-2016 yearbooks. Some were in tears because they were losing work and out of space. Even though we are working to release a RFP to expand our storage area network, this doesn’t solve the Journalism teachers immediate issue. Working on Saturday, **October 24, 2015**, Greg resolved the problem accomplishing the following:

1. Created a 10 terabyte volume on an older server
2. Created 10 high school folders for each of the 10 campuses
3. Limited each to 1 terabyte
4. Set up rights for each folder to just be for that campus’s journalism group
5. Created a drive map O: through group policy for employees/students that are in the journalism groups
